
## Road Safety Magic Show

## Reading at Home

Evidence shows that the more you read with children the more success they will have at school. A little every day goes a long way to achieving this.

Ever wondered why your chid has so many books in their book bag?

Each child at Witley can choose as many sharing books as they want from the classroom. These books are for you to read together and don't worry if your child wants to read the same book again and again – that's normal. They will also have a library book and a reading spine book.

In the book bag you'll also find their Little Wandle decodable reading book. This is the one they have been focussing on in class with their teacher and should be able to read independently to you using decoding (match letters to sounds), reading with expression (prosody), and explain the meaning of new words.



## How do I get started?

If you're not feeling confident about reading aloud don't worry – there's no wrong way to enjoy a story together. But if you'd like some tips, here are a few to help you out.

- Cuddle up together. Your child could hold the book themselves and turn the pages, too!
- Take a book out and about with you why not see if you can spot real-life things that remind you of the stories?
- Try being one of the characters, making silly voices and actions. Your little one will love it!
- Reading is for anytime, anywhere. On the bus, at the park books are great for quick entertainment.
- You don't have to read a book cover to cover, you can just dip in and out.
- Just have fun! There's no right or wrong way to share a story do what works for you and your child.

## ATTENDANCE MATTERS

#### **Dear Parents/Carers**

We have received several requests for time off school for holidays. Sadly under the new guidelines introduced in the summer these absences will be unauthorised and you may be liable to a penalty notice incurring a fine. Please read the information below, so you are fully aware of the guidance.

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of  $\pounds$ 160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to  $\pounds$ 80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, **per parent/carer per child**, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.


