New reading diaries for September 2025



Our reading diaries are slightly different this year with a 'week to view' on each double page spread.



School staff will use the left-hand side and parents/carers use the right-hand side to record any reading completed at home i.e. Little Wandle book/bedtime story shared together.


You will also find some optional fun challenges at the bottom of each page to complete at home!

Some things to remember...

- Staff do not always read to every child/look in the diary every day, so any URGENT messages need to be emailed to the class teacher or the office
- Our expectation is that your child will read their Little Wandle book at home at least three times a week, building up fluency and expression. If you read at the weekends you can add a comment in the Friday section
- Our wonderful volunteers will also write comments
- Additional spellings/information may be stuck in the diary for pupils to learn
- Please encourage your child to keep their reading diary in the plastic wallet provided, along with their Little Wandle book
- We refer to tricky words as sight words (words that are read automatically with no decoding)

Research evidences that the more often your child practises reading the

more they will enjoy all kinds of books and become confident, fluent readers with good vocabulary and understanding. Reading opens the door to learning, so we recommend reading 'little and often' to give your child the best start.
