Writing helps children organise their thoughts, understand language, express emotions, and develop important motor skills. It serves as a tool for learning, problemsolving, and making sense of the world around them.

We may not write a lot these days, thanks to iPhones, tablets and laptops; and gone are the days of a handwritten shopping list, but being able to match letters to sounds and write

How you can encourage writing at a young age:

messages opens a whole doorway to learning and expression.

Writing birthday or thank you cards, signs and lists, letters or messages to relatives can be motivating real-life reasons for writing, and can show children how useful it is to be able to write well. They will also learn that we use different writing styles in different situations. Try writing spellings (KS1) on bits of paper and hide them around the room as a game.

It's also important for your child to see you write, so ask them to tell you their favourite things for a list or ask them to tell you a story and write it for them!



Subject: Important information about catering and equipment maintenance services for schools and settings provided by Twelve15

Surrey County Council is currently undertaking a review of its school catering and equipment maintenance services, provided by Twelve15. Throughout Surrey there are many ways in which schools procure these services. Some choose to procure these through the council, and others use private providers.

As you may be aware, councils are currently facing financial challenges across the country and because of these challenges, we must regularly review the services we offer, including discretionary services such as Twelve15, and make changes to ensure long-term sustainability.

As part of this review, several options have been considered for the future of catering and equipment maintenance for the Council to remain both effective and financially stable. These options will be presented to Surrey County Council's Cabinet on 23 September with a recommended way forward.

Surrey Twelve15 Update below:

Dear parents and carers

Following the Surrey County Council Cabinet meeting on 23 September, a decision was made to enter a period of consultation and engagement to gain input from staff and schools on the proposal to close catering and equipment maintenance services, provided by Twelve15.

Surrey County Council plan to start the consultation on 1 October, in line with necessary guidance for Cabinet decision-making processes and the consultation will run until 15 November 2025.

It is important to reiterate that no final decision will be made until after the consultation. Once the consultation has closed all feedback will be reviewed prior to a final decision.

Another update will be shared once the consultation has finished and a final decision has been made.
