Little Wandle Phonics

Here at Witley we use the Little Wandle phonics programme which is the fastest growing Department for Education-validated phonics programme, already supporting over 5,500 schools to teach every child to learn to read!



World Book Day 2025

Learning to read opens the doors to learning and we are asking you to support your child at home with their reading. Just five to ten minutes every day does make a significant difference to your child being able to access the wider curriculum, grow in confidence and play a significant part in their learning environment. There are three types of reading book that your child may bring home:

- A reading practice book. This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.

- Sharing books. Your child will not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.
- Library book. Your child will choose this on their own to share with you at home.

Kings College research study in Puffin Class

We are very pleased to be able to share some news about a research study that we are involved in with Dr Charlotte Tye of Kings College. Thank you to those parents who have consented for their children to take part.



The study is called SCALE – Sensory Contexts and Learning Environments and it is aimed at investigating how children's sensory experiences, mood and classroom environments affect their readiness to learn.

- Handbags and belts



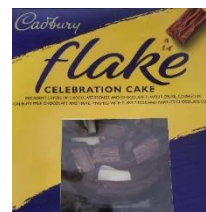

Online Safety

Every month we send out an Online Safety newsletter for parents which has a wealth of information to help your family stay safe online. Below is an extract from our January newsletter which everyone received before Christmas.

Playing games online

Does your child play games online? We have outlined some risks that you should consider:



Chatting to strangers / risk of inappropriate language

Some games will allow communication via text chat, direct messages or chatting. Some games do offer the ability to switch communication off and/or the option to restrict bad language, so make sure settings appropriate to your child are applied. If your child is playing online with strangers, then you need to be aware that there is a risk of grooming. Some games do allow you to restrict communication to 'friends only,' however you would need to monitor that their online friends are real life friends. It can be difficult to moderate online chat so ensure your child knows how to block and report other players.

Cyberbullying

It can be very easy online for children to behave in a way that they would not if they were face to face. Talk to your child about how they speak to others online and encourage them to talk to people online with respect. Other forms of cyberbullying whilst playing games could be excluding others, criticising the ability of other players and ganging up on others.

In app purchases

Many games include the option to purchase additional items/ subscriptions so ensure you do not have payment cards saved or set up restrictions/ a password to approve purchases.

What can I do?

- **Set up parental controls** - as well as setting up appropriate parental controls through the game's settings, ensure you have set them up on the console/device your child is playing on.
- **Check age ratings** - before buying the game, check that your child is old enough to play it. All games will either have a PEGI rating or be rated by the App Store/Google Play.
- **Chat to your child regularly** about the risks above so that they are aware of what can happen online and remind them to always talk to you or a trusted adult if they have any concerns

Consultation launched about Play and Leisure Short Breaks in Surrey

Play & Leisure Short Breaks

Play & Leisure Short Breaks give children and young people the chance to participate in educational and leisure activities in community venues across Surrey, and also give parent carers a break from caring.

What is the consultation about?

There are changes being proposed to the Short Breaks programme. The proposals are to ensure the programme remains sustainable and effective, and to provide greater equity and fairness in the process, so we can prioritise resource and manage demand.

The vision for Play and Leisure Short Breaks is an offer that prioritises **inclusive access**, **community integration**, and **cost-effective support** for those with the greatest need, across both specialist and mainstream community schemes.

This sits alongside needing to identify efficiencies and cost savings as part of the council’s need to achieve a balanced budget. In January 2025 the Surrey County Council Cabinet set out the budget for 2025/26, which incorporates the need to find £66 million in efficiencies across the council over the medium term. This includes £800,000 to be saved in 2026/27 from the Short Breaks budget of £2.56 million, while still meeting the council’s Short Breaks

statutory duties.

There are a number of proposals for the programme, which include:

- Introducing eligibility criteria
- Introducing a maximum level of provision that each child can access each year
- Focusing on inclusive mainstream provision alongside specialist provision, so that children can interact and play with a wide range of other children and feel part of the community
- Ensuring parent carer charges are consistent
- Providing flexible session lengths, and a greater proportion of sessions in the school holidays.

The feedback we receive will help us to shape services that are fair, and better in line with current and future needs, whilst also remaining affordable and delivering good value for money with the available budget.

We are also running some informal in-person and online events, where families and professionals can find out more about the proposed changes and ask any questions they have.
